RECAP of Fr. Sylvain's Presentation our story begins - <u>'in the beginning'</u> with the **Genesis story**

God took dust & "breathed" life into Adam (breath of God = Holy Spirit)

Eve taken from the side of Adam

2 TREESINTHE GARDEN!

1. The Tree of Eternal Life

2. The Tree of the Knowledge of Good & Evil

-serpent tempted Adam & Eve with eating from Tree of Knowledge of good & evil

-what gain? ..already walking with God - already 'knew' GOOD!

-so 'gain' was to 'know' EVIL!

EVIL = SIN = Separation from God (the only thing God didn't want for us is <u>separation from Him</u>!)

now Adam & Eve felt the need to hide from God because they <u>'knew they were</u> naked'


shame in sin - tried to hide their sin from God

God "punished" or "put a curse" upon the woman & man. Both curses relate to love & procreation.

These would still exist, but in a <u>BROKEN state</u>...not as they should be.

Love & procreation will now 'hurt': planting of seeds in <u>soil</u> & in the <u>womb</u> would result in work & pain in order to get at the joy

ETERNALLY BROKEN!



How does God RESTORE this broken relationship?

in time, God sent His Son, Jesus, to <u>take on</u> <u>our sins</u> & take them to the CROSS & die for our SALVATION!




The <u>CROSS</u> is the new "TREE OF ETERNALLIFE"

JESUS is the FRUIT of the Tree of Eternal life!

Jesus' death on the Cross restored us back to the <u>Garden</u> <u>of Eden</u>!

At the Cross (tree of Eternal Life), Jesus is pierced & BLOOD & WATER flow from his side





when else does <u>BLOOD</u> & <u>WATER</u> flow from a human???...

when else does BLOOD & WATER flow from a human??... at BRTH!

At the CROSS, Jesus is giving BIRTH to <u>HIS</u> <u>CHURCH!</u>

Jesus on the Tree of Eternal Life is the <u>NEW ADAM</u>;

Mary, the <u>NEW EVE</u>, is present;

John, the disciple representing all of humanity/the <u>Church</u> is present.



The Blood & Water represent the Sacrament of <u>BAPTISM</u> (entry into the Church - entry into eternal life with God)

When we join ourselves to God through Jesus... when we restore the brokenness through <u>Baptism</u>...

<u>NOW</u> we can eat of the <u>fruit</u> of the Tree of <u>E</u>ternal Life! Jesus Christ in the

> EUCHARIST! Body & Blood

When Jesus <u>breathed</u> His last, He sent out the <u>HOLY SPIRIT</u> on Mary & John & <u>all they represented....</u> <u>the Church...</u>

Jesus' <u>breath</u> is the sending forth of the HOLY SPIRIT in the

Sacrament of CONFIRMATION



The Holy Spirit is also seen as <u>tongues of FIRE</u> sent upon His Church at Pentecost - thus giving them the POWER from on high! As our former Pastor, Fr. Sylvain Casavant, was fond of saying: "on the 1st page of the Bible, we are <u>in the Garden</u> with God; on the next page, we've <u>fallen</u> out of the Garden; and for the whole rest of the Bible, God is trying to get us <u>back into</u> the Garden <u>with Him</u>!"

Our Journey back into the Garden with God begins with The Sacraments of <u>Initiation</u>:

> BAPTISM CONFIRMATION HOLY EUCHARIST

WOW! That sounds AWESOME... But, How do I <u>prepare</u> for Baptism, Confirmation & Holy Eucharist!

> I've been on the RCIA Journey, and I've learned some good "stuff"... But how do I prepare this "cracked vessel" of mine to <u>RECEIVE</u> THE BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST!

> > Well, Let's TAKE A LOOK

Take a look at what?

- The SCRUTINIES
- Examining your CONSCIENCE
- Ways to overcome SIN
- The gift of the SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION
 - HOW TO 'go to Confession'

3 RITES for self-searching and repentance

- to <u>uncover</u>, then <u>heal</u> all that is <u>weak</u>, defective, or sinful
- to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good
- to <u>deliver</u> the elect from the <u>power of</u> <u>sin and Satan</u>,
- to protect them against temptation
- to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life.

Before celebrating the three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist), the elect must:

- have the intention of achieving an *intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church*
- progress in genuine self-knowledge through serous examination of their lives and true repentance.

Through the three scrutinies the elect are instructed gradually about the *mystery of sin*, from which all long to be delivered and thus saved from its present and future consequences.

Second, their *spirit is filled with Christ* the Redeemer, who is:

- **the living water** (gospel of the Samaritan woman in the first
- the light of the world (gospel of the man born blind in the second scrutiny),
- the resurrection and the life (gospel of Lazarus in the third scrutiny).





From the first to the final scrutiny the elect should **progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation.**

Examination of Conscience what?? What?? a there a

Conscience is:

- Judgment of Reason
- A law of the mind
- A messenger

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC1795) states: "Conscience is Man's most **secret core** & his sanctuary. There he is **alone with God** whose voice echoes in his depths"

- <u>Obliged</u> to follow what you <u>KNOW</u> to be JUST & RIGHT
- We must NOT be forced to act AGAINST our Conscience!

What is 'Conscience'?!?

John Henry Cardinal Newman states:

"Conscience is a messenger of Him, who, both in nature & in grace, speaks to us behind a veil, & teaches & rules us by His representatives. Conscience is the aboriginal Vicar of Christ."

The WORD of God is a lamp unto my feet & a light unto my path! (Ps 119:105)


HOW do I "form" my Conscience?



- Examine your conscience before the <u>Cross</u>
- Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you
- Ask others in the Church to help (including the Saints!)
- Seek guidance from the Church teachings



Making Moral Choices



RULES FOR DISCERNMENT OF GOD'S WILL:

- Never do EVIL so that GOOD may result
- "Golden Rule"= "Whatever you wish that men would do to you, do so to them" (Mt 7:12)
- Be CHARITABLE respect the other's conscience don't make your brother stumble (Rom 14:21)

What if I'm 'wrong'



- Errors in judgment are possible, especially if we remain "unaware" (ignorant) of our ability to seek God's will
- We have a PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY to seek TRUTH & GOOD



BAPTISM

RECONCILIATIO N

Every sincere act of worship or devotion revives the spirit of conversion Š repentance within us & contributes to the forgiveness of our sins (CCC 1437)

"HOW TO" of the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Begin

Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been x number of weeks/months since my last confession (or: this is my 1st confession) these are my sins... (list them)

Finish with something like:

For these sins, and for any sins I may have forgotten, I am truly sorry.

Priest will usually give some guidance/spiritual advice.

Priest will impose a penance. Usually the penance is something that can be fulfilled right there in the Church (eg: pray 3 Our Fathers etc). Sometimes, it may involve making some form of reparation for the sin (returning a stolen item; or apologizing to a sister etc).

"HOW TO" of the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Priest asks penitent to make an Act of Contrition

"O my God, I am sorry for my sins, and with your help I will try not to sin again."; or

"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me, a sinner."; or

"O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins, because of Your just punishments, but most of all because they offend You, my God, who are allgood and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin.

Priest absolves the penitent & makes a sign of the cross

Make a sign of the Cross

Go do your penance (it completes your Reconciliation)

Discuss the 'Examination of Conscience' provided



In the rite of <u>exorcism</u> within the scrutinies, the elect, who have learned from the Church the mystery of deliverance from sin by Christ,

- are <u>freed</u> from the <u>effects of sin</u> and from the <u>influence of the devil</u>.
- receive new <u>strength</u> in the midst of their spiritual journey
- open their hearts to receive the gifts of the Savior.
