A love letter from Hilarion to his pregnant wife Alis (circa 1 BC)

"Know that I am still in Alexandria. And do not worry if they all come back and I remain in Alexandria. I ask and beg you to take good care of our baby son, and as soon as I receive payment I shall send it up to you. If you are delivered of a child [before I come home], if it is a boy keep it, if a girl discard it. You have sent me word, "Don't forget me." How can I forget you. I beg you not to worry."

Infanticide

- Greco/Romans sanctioned and encouraged infanticide
- Infants were left exposed to the elements at day old – if someone else wanted them they could have them
- Girls were most likely the victims "more than one daughter was practically never reared"
- Delphi inscriptions of over 600 families only 6 raised more than one daughter
- Discovery at the dig at Ashkelon

Abortion, contraception and adultery

Abortion was very common	Abortion is very common
A wide range of contraceptives were available, both physical and chemical	A wide range of contraceptives are available, both physical and chemical
Men could legally compel any woman in his household (wife, daughter, slave) to have an abortion without her consent.	Our culture compels women to have abortions rather than looking at alternatives.
Adultery was common for men – strictly forbidden for women	Adultery is common for men and women.
Low birth rate throughout the pagan world	Low birth rate throughout the western world

Teaching on Family

- Precedes and is the foundation of all societies – primary cell
- Based on marriage of man and woman
- Society must strengthen and protect the family

- Marriage Good of spouses and procreation of children
- "Grave responsibility to set a good example"
- Children contribute to holiness of parents



Parental Duty: Evangelize and Educate

Education

- Church defends the right of parents to determine and provide for the education of their children
- Must extend to moral education and spiritual formation
- Catechism of the Church
- Speaking about your faith

Discipline

- He who loves his son will not spare the rod....He who disciplines his son will profit by him. – Sirach 30:1-2
- As Jesus was obedient to the Father, so children must be obedient to their parents
- Basis for all just authority
- Train to be a good person
- Discern vocation guidance

Gifts of the Holy Spirit

- Wisdom → see reality from God's point of view
- Understanding → deeper meaning of faith

- Fortitude → strength to follow our convictions
- Piety → respect Lord with praise and worship and dignity of others
- Fear of Lord → concern of reality of sin in our life
