Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 3, 2019

“Jesus passed through the midst of them and went on His way.”

Rave reviews greeted Jesus 'first hometown homily proclaiming a year of God's mercy, but the mood turned violent when He went on to declare that God's mercy embraces outsiders; it rejects distinction between citizen and foreigner, acceptable and unworthy, even sinner and saint. Far from being anyone's personal possession, God's kingdom is open to everyone, God's love unconditional, God's mercy boundless. Our Popes often repeated Jesus' challenge in today's Gospel to broaden our horizons until our vision matches Jesus' vision of every sinner as a potential saint, and each suffering stranger as our neighbour. Jesus continually went beyond the law, keeping company with public sinners and even sharing meals with them to demonstrate that God's mercy is "the beating heart of the Gospel." To be truly Jesus' disciples, such unconditional love and boundless mercy must also be at the center of all we say and do.

Times for Confessions

It is encouraging to see the large numbers who seek forgiveness and grace through the sacrament of Reconciliation.



It has been the practice in the parish to have confessions only on Saturday before evening Mass. We priests often come at 3:30 to find a line forming. There is always time for a few confessions but priests need time to spiritually prepare to celebrate the Eucharist and cannot deal adequately with this long line. If Saturday confession has become your practice, please consider one of the other available times.

Confessions are available daily one hour before Mass; that is at 8:00am Wednesday to Saturday and 6:00pm Monday and Tuesday. The Archdiocese Day of Confessions will be on March 12, with confession available throughout the entire day and evening. As well, there will be a parish penitential service during Lent with many priests present. Confession is also available anytime you come to church and a priest is present.

Few things accelerate the feeling of peace as much as admitting our sins and asking forgiveness.

BAPTISM

Registration: By appointment for baptism of infants to 7 years. Baptism is necessary for salvation and therefore it is recommended that parents baptize their children as soon as possible after their birth.



Preparation: Monday, March 18 (7 to 9pm) and Saturday, April 13 (10am to noon) - for parents & godparents – you do not need to have registered the child for baptism to be able to take this class. The baptism preparation requirement can be met before the child is born thereby allowing the baptism to occur more readily after the arrival.

Brochure: For process, requirements, dates offered for preparation etc. please refer to the baptism brochure. You will find it in the stand at the main entrance to the church and at the **Sacraments** link on our website stm.caedm.ca.

Note: Baptisms are not typically celebrated during the penitential time of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 6). In serious circumstances, exceptions can be made, but otherwise, baptisms will not occur until after Easter (April 21).
