Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

January 13, 2019

Ordinary Time

We begin the time of the Church calendar called Ordinary Time; it begins with the Monday following the Baptism of the Lord. Ordinary Time refers to all of those parts of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church - the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting or in more severe penance but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects".

The normal liturgical color - for those days when there is no special feast - is green, the colour of hope and growth. There are 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary time, split in two parts, the time between Christmas and Lent, and the time after the Easter season.

Prayers for the Sick

We care about the sick and suffering in our parish and pray for them daily. Our parish is too large to mention individuals in the prayers of the faithful but they are included in the intentions of the rosary that we pray before the Eucharist.



Please give us the names of the sick members of our community of faith who need prayer and we will publish them in the bulletin. The parish pastoral care groups arrange for special Masses and prayers for those in homes and with special needs.

February 11 is World Day of the Sick, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes; we will have special prayers and blessings on that day.

The Reborn series not only help parents and godparents prepare for the Baptism of their child/godchild but also prepares them to be witnessing disciples of Christ in their families and in the ordinary places of secular culture in which they live, work, and play.

- ◆ **Session 1: A New Creation:** Discusses Baptism as the heart of God's plan of salvation from the beginning and the entry point into the New Covenant established in Christ between God and his people.
- ◆ **Session 2: Entering the Mystery:** Examines the Rite of Baptism to prepare parents and godparents to participate fruitfully in the Sacrament.
- ◆ **Session 3: Nurturing the Life of Grace:** Focuses on the role of the parents and godparents as being the first teachers of the child in the ways of the Faith and their call to be compelling witnesses of the Christian life.
