Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 10, 2019

“Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.”

Pope Francis calls us to share with everyone the tender compassion of God that we ourselves experience. We experience God’s mercy in the unconditional forgiveness of our sins. How eager we should be to invite others to know the peace of God’s boundless mercy; perhaps even to experience, through our reaching out in gentle kindness and compassionate care, something of God’s unconditional love for them.

In today’s Gospel, Luke tells us that Jesus proclaims a radical message where he called His disciples to be “fishers” of people, tenderly caring for the prisoner, the homeless, the hungry, the sick, the lonely and well-being of all humanity.

In Luke’s vision – and Pope Francis’ as well – we are to become “missionaries of mercy” rescuing fellow sinners from danger and gathering them into Jesus’ community to enjoy fullness of life.

World Day of the Sick

The ministry of Jesus to the sick is central to the life of the Church. February 11 (Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes) highlights the healing ministry of the Church.



On this day, the Sacrament of the Sick will be available during our evening Mass. If you are sick, suffering or elderly, we invite you to receive the sacrament. Please help your sick family members to come to the church. Our church is very easily accessible for those with mobility problems.

Times for Confessions



It is encouraging to see the large numbers who seek forgiveness and grace through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It has been the practice in the parish to have confessions only on Saturday before evening Mass. We priests often come at 3:30 to find a line forming. There is always time for a few confessions but priests need time to spiritually prepare to celebrate the Eucharist and cannot deal adequately with this long line. If Saturday confession has become your practice, please consider one of the other available times.

Confessions are available daily one hour before Mass:

Monday and Tuesday at 6:00 pm and

Wednesday to Saturday at 8:00 am.

The Archdiocese *Day of Confessions* will be on **March 12**, with confession available *throughout the entire day and evening*. As well, there will be a Parish Penitential Service during Lent with many priests present. Confession is also available anytime you come to church and a priest is present.

Few things accelerate the feeling of peace as much as admitting our sins and asking forgiveness.



BAPTISM

Registration: By appointment for baptism of infants to 7 years. Baptism is necessary for salvation and therefore it is recommended that parents baptize their children as soon as possible after their birth.

Preparation: Monday, March 18 (7 to 9pm) and Saturday, April 13 (10am to noon) - for parents & godparents – you do not need to have registered the child for baptism to be able to take this class. The baptism preparation requirement can be met before the child is born thereby allowing the baptism to occur more readily after the arrival.

Brochure: For process, requirements, dates offered for preparation etc. please refer to the baptism brochure. You will find it in the stand at the main entrance to the church and at the **Sacraments** link on our website stm.caedm.ca.



Note: Baptisms are not typically celebrated during the penitential time of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 6). In serious circumstances, exceptions can be made, but otherwise, baptisms will not occur until after Easter (April 21).
