Second Sunday of Lent February 28, 2021

"How good it is for us to be here."



The three great friends of Jesus saw their friend on the mountain one minute, and the glory of God the next. They had been listening to Him and watching Him for a long time now. They had seen miraculous healings, demons expelled, crowds moved to astonishment by His words.

And now, staring at Him, they saw light, authority, and the favour of God.

Was this something new, or had it been there before? Had their eyes gotten adjusted at last to the vision of Jesus, leaving their blindness behind them?

Since the three did not know what to say on the mountain, Jesus tells them not to say anything at all as they descend. So much can be lost in the transmission of a vision. And a transfiguration is too powerful an image to risk losing it in speech.

As we enter the sanctuary at St Thomas More, our eyes are drawn to the central banner honouring St Joseph. It serves as a reminder that this year has been proclaimed the Year of St. Joseph. LENT AND THE FAMILY

Given the many challenges facing today's families, now is the perfect time, and home is the perfect place, to experience Lent. After all, home is where we rush and rest, where we hope and worry, where we love and forgive. It is at home where we most often experience day-to-day salvation. Lenten experiences can take place in nearly every room of the house. Here are some simple ideas to try to enrich your celebration of Lent as a family:

- 1) Pray together as a family to celebrate the presence of God in the midst of everyday life.
- Fast from some food.Fast from TV one day of the week.Fast from electronic games one day of the week.Fast from bad habits that need to be changed.
- 3) Plan simple meal together.
- 4) Schedule a family night.
- 5) Write one (your own) Station of the Cross.
- 6) Practice the 3 C's: give three compliments a day to a friend and/or a family member, and talk about it at dinnertime.
- 7) Blessing: parents, bless your children by making the sign of the cross on their forehead before they go to bed at night, or when they leave for school each day; then ask your children to bless you.
