

"Whose side are you on?"



In today's Gospel, the disciples of Jesus overstepped their boundaries. A man who was not one of the Twelve was driving out demons in the name of Jesus. They tried to stop him. John brings to Jesus the same saga Joshua brought to Moses: *someone not from our company is speaking in the name of the Lord*.

Jesus points out that anyone expelling demons in His name is likely to be on His side. It is an argument He uses with those who questioned His own power over demons: might He be in league with Lucifer? Jesus countered: Lucifer is having a bad day if he is casting out his own demons! There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who at the same time can speak ill of me.

Whoever is not against us is for us.

Good fruit comes from good hearts, and rotten fruit from rotten hearts. It is a simple enough formula to understand. Jesus moves much further than we would like in this argument. He says whatever leads us into sin is not worth possessing.

Next week we celebrate two days that are dedicated to God's messengers, the angels. Wednesday, September 29, is the feast of the Archangels; and on Saturday, October 2, we honor our Guardian Angels.




Join thousands across Canada in this peaceful demonstration standing in support of the life of the unborn!
