Whether you are expecting the birth of your child or your child has already been born, it is time to consider the gift of baptism for your child.

Preparation for the Sacrament of Baptism

Choosing a Godparent (Sponsor)

To be chosen as a Godparent (sponsor) is a special gift and responsibility. The Godparent(s) should be a faithful, practicing Catholic who will provide an example of a life of faith lived through word and action.



In **Baptism**, the role of parents and godparents is important. Parents and godparents are representatives of God and the Catholic Church, serving as the primary teachers of the faith, and caring for the spiritual needs of the child throughout his/her life.

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 4th Sunday of every month (and on the 2nd Sunday if demand necessitates).

Registration for both preparation and celebration of the sacrament are required.

Gather the following:

- Child’s long form birth certificate (copy)
- 4 X 6 photograph of the child
- \$20 to cover cost of materials

Baptism Preparation

Attendance at baptismal preparation is **mandatory** for first-time parents and Godparents or those haven't attended any baptismal preparation at all. However, everyone is welcome to attend the sessions if desired.

A child’s baptismal date can be tentatively reserved but will only to be confirmed upon completion of the baptismal preparation session.

There are two options:

1. Attend a **90-minute in-person class** on the 1st or 3rd Saturday of the month from 10-11:30 am prior to the Baptism date.
OR
2. An **online program** may be offered, if needed.

- **Godparents** must be at least 16 years of age, and have received the 3 Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation, and be practicing their faith.
- **Godparents** set a good Christian example and support the parent(s) in raising the child in the Catholic faith.
- **By church law**, one Godparent, male or female is sufficient. If two are chosen, one must be female and the other male.
- **A maximum of 2 Godparents**
OR
1 Godparent and 1 Christian Witness
(one male and one female)



- **A baptized Christian** may act as a Christian Witness but not as a Godparent. His or her role would be to witness to Christ for the sake of this newly baptized child. If you would like to choose someone as a Christian witness, the parents must still chose a Godparent.
