SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: No Regular Confessions during Holy week and the octave of Easter, confessions will resume on April 8

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Parents wishing to have their child baptized are asked to pre-register with Tracy Lam. The next in-person Baptismal class is scheduled for April 6, 20 & May 18. The course is scheduled for 10-11:30 am. The next online Baptismal Prep is Apr 13, 10-11am. Parents/Legal Guardians should be registered parishioners. Women who are nearing their expected delivery date may consider attending even before the child is born. Upcoming Sundays for Baptism celebrations will be celebrated on April 14, 28, May 5 and June 9. RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434-6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7-9 pm.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil Weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!

For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.

SICK OR SHUT-INS: To request Holy Communion please call the parish office, (780) 434-6313.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually 2 times a year. Watch for the date in early Fall or in the New Year.

Sunday Gospel Reflection

TO FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE OF JESUS (MARK 14:1-15:47)

By enduring great sufferings in his lifetime, Jesus showed us how we should view suffering in our own lives. Jesus did not view suffering as an evil inflicted by God as the real evil in this world is the sin we commit ourselves.

As Jesus used suffering to redeem mankind, we can use the suffering in our own lives as a means of gaining grace and obtaining salvation. His crucifixion teaches us how we can endure suffering by offering it up as a sacrifice for our own sins and imperfections.

Jesus's words, "Father, into your hands I commend my Spirit" were a direct quote from the 31st Psalm of King David, written centuries before. Where did Jesus learn this? From his mothers' knee as this was the psalm customarily said by the Jewish people as their night

prayer before going to bed.

Imagine Jesus, as a child, learning this from our Blessed Mother as he prayed each night offering his life and work to God, his Father and now in death, was offering him his sufferings.

Jesus, our Savior, first offered himself for us and then continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow. As Jesus was willing to empty himself for our sake, we are to empty ourselves for the sake of others.


Let us remember that those last immortalized words that Jesus spoke were taught to Him by his mother, Mary, and are an inspiration to all parents who teach their children to pray.


