World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly July 28



The Fourth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will be celebrated on Sunday, July 28. The Holy Father's message underscores the theme "Do not cast me off in my old age" (Psalm 71:9) invites the Catholic faithful to reflect on the loneliness of the elderly and the role of the Church in addressing it.

In view of the special day, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has prepared a Pastoral Toolkit designed to promote "a day without loneliness". The toolkit includes the official logo, a catechesis on old age. recent texts from the Magisterium, the official prayer for the World Day, and pastoral suggestions. The Holy Father's Message and the toolkit are

also available online, as well as available for viewing and downloading on Google Drive. To promote World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, the Dicastery suggests using the official logo and the hashtaq #GrandparentsandElderly.






NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year. Watch for the date in early Fall or in the New Year.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Group Baptisms are celebrated during all seasons, except during Advent and Lent. We are accepting Infant Baptism registrations year round, from unborn baby to children under the age of 7. Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents. We offer 3 different options for both in-person and online preparations. In-person preparation classes are available on Aug 3, Sept 7 & Oct 5 from 10-11:30am while the Zoom meetings for the 2nd part of the "Belonging" online program are available on July 20, Aug 10, Sept 14 & Oct 19 from 10-11am. We strongly encourage families to register and complete their preparation as early as possible. Baptisms will be celebrated on July 28, Aug 18, Sept 22 & Oct 27. SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old as this is considered the age of reason. 2024-2025 dates and registration instructions will be announced at the beginning of September 2024 before Sunday Masses, via parish bulletins and website: https://stm.caedm.ca/first-reconciliation-first-eucharist/ You could email our Pastoral Coordinator first-eucharist.stm@caedm.ca



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. 2024-2025 dates and registration instructions will be announced in September before Sunday Masses and via parish bulletins and website: https://stm.caedm.ca/confirmation-prep In 2024-2025 there will be 2 cycles offered in Fall and Spring on Monday evenings. SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil Weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.



Marriage Enrichment: Marriage Enrichment Retreat dates Sep 16, 23, Oct 7, 21, 28, Nov 4, 18, 25 & Dec 2 & 9.
