Be Last to be First (Mark 9:30-37)

to lie on, in death.

When the Disciples argue with one another about who was the greatest, they are told they must take last place to be first with Jesus and be a Disciple of his, to be willing to be like a child ("last of all") and Let us imitate the humility of Jesus, and let our greatness be in a slave ("servant to all"). With the heart of a servant we are to serving others.

Jesus humbled himself to come to earth, choosing the wood of the welcome others without consideration of what we will receive in manger on which to lie on, in birth and the wood of the cross on which return, and refuse to show favoritism or prejudice toward others, especially toward those who are weak and vulnerable.

Jesus tells us to, "learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in By receiving a child, we are receiving Jesus, and by receiving Jesus heart." (Matt 11:29), for at the Last Supper (Holy Thursday), the night we are receiving the Father. We must make ourselves servants to before his death, Jesus gave us the great Sacrament of the Eucharist, each other and all people, living a humble life of giving, thinking about the needs of others, and helping them to be all that God has called them to be, as no one is too small for the kingdom and no work is too small for God's kingdom.





NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year. Watch for the date in early Fall or in the New Year.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated during all seasons, except during Advent and Lent. We are accepting Infant Baptism registrations year round, from unborn baby to children under the age of 7. Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents. We offer 3 different options for both in-person and online preparations. In-person preparation classes are available on Oct 5, Nov 2 & Dec 7 from 10-11:30am while the Zoom meetings for the 2nd part of the "Belonging" online program are available on Oct 19, Nov 9 & Dec 14 from 10-11am. We strongly encourage families to register and complete their preparation as early as possible. Baptisms will be celebrated on Sept 22, Oct 27, Nov 17 and more dates in 2025 are available on our website.

For Later Baptism: We are happy to accommodate children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age appropriate sacraments. All infant and children baptism requirements, preparation options and schedule details are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacrament and Baptism. SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old as this is considered the age of reason. Registration for 2024-2025 1st Reconciliation & 1st Holy Eucharist are now OPEN. To register your child please fill the Online Registration Form or use the QR code



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Registration for 2024-2025 Confirmation are now OPEN. To register your child please fill the Online Registration Form or use the QR code

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.
