

Come to Jesus and See (Mark 10:46-52)

It is hard to believe that Jesus would ask us what He could do for us. vet sometimes that is the question we must answer. Bartimaeus was blind, and he knew exactly what he wanted Jesus to do for him, to restore his sight. He received not only physical sight but salvation, using his gift to become a follower of Jesus.

When Jesus asked James and John what they wanted him to do for them, their request was selfish and like them, we often want Jesus to bring the news of his love to all those we come in contact with in our do things for us that are selfish and focused on this world.

If God does not give us what we are asking, we should think about what we are praying for. Are our motives selfish, blocked by Otherwise, when Jesus comes to us and asks what we want, we are unconfessed sin, or do we lack the faith God requires to give us what not going to say, "Restore my sight."



Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year. Watch for the date in early Fall or in the New Year.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated during all seasons, except during Advent and Lent. We are accepting Infant Baptism registrations year round, from unborn baby to children under the age of 7. Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents. We offer 3 different options for both in-person and online preparations. In-person preparation classes are available on Nov 2, Dec 7 & Jan 18 from 10-11:30am while the Zoom meetings for the 2nd part of the "Belonging" online program are available on Nov 9, Dec 14 & Jan 11 from 10-11am. We strongly encourage families to register and complete their preparation as early as possible. Baptisms will be celebrated on Nov 17 and January 5 & 26, more dates in 2025 are available on our website .

For Later Baptism: We are happy to accommodate children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age appropriate sacraments. All infant and children baptism requirements, preparation options and schedule details are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacrament and Baptism. Kindly email all baptism enquiries to Baptism.STM@caedm.ca or contact Tracy/Bernardine at the office (780) 434 6313 for further assistance.

SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old as this is considered the age of reason. Registration for 2024-2025 1st Reconciliation & 1st Holy Eucharist are now OPEN. To register your child please fill the Online Registration Form or use the QR code

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Registration for 2024-2025 Confirmation are now OPEN. To register your child please fill the Online Registration Form or use the QR code

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!

For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.

Marriage Enrichment: Marriage Enrichment Retreat dates Oct 21, 28, Nov 4, 18, 25 & Dec 2 & 9.

RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thurs evenings 7 to 9 pm.
