

# Sunday Gospel Reflection

## Our Call (Luke 5:1-11)

The call described today is not just a summons to faith, but a call to the ministry. As Isaiah is called in order to be sent and the fishermen are called in order to gather others to Jesus, each of us has been given a special call (or vocation) to follow a particular path in life. Not all vocations are the same. Some of us are called to religious life, others to a married state. Some of us know quite early in life what we want to be and some of us are undecided for many years.

As life transforming as this call may be, it comes to us in the ordinary times of life, like it did for St. Peter and his companions. Like St. Peter, the call of God will usually come to us as we wash our nets

or our dishes, as we teach or raise children, prepare a brief for the office, examine a patient, repair our car or work at the computer. We are called by God to be sent out into the world. The faith has been given to us, and we in turn are to give it to others.

Let us pray for the strength to accept the call and not be afraid; stepping forward to continue the mission of Jesus, proclaiming, teaching and preaching, nursing the sick, caring for the elderly, taking the Word of God to our workplaces, weeding out prejudice and violence, and changing the world for ourselves and our children.


### Sacrament of Marriage



In our Parish, we have three Permanent Deacons – Randy Abele, Tom Sudsbear, and Gordon Taylor. Each of them celebrates Liturgies, attends special events as requested, and ministers to schools and senior homes in our parish. They also assist in the spiritual life of the parish by preaching regularly at Mass, and in the preparation of our parishioners and their children for sacraments.

A permanent deacon's ministry evolves in response to specific needs and his God-given talents. There are three dimensions of diaconal service: Ministry of Love and Justice, Ministry of the Word of God, and Ministry within the Liturgy. Permanent deacons prepare the faithful to celebrate the sacraments and to carry out their vocations as baptized Christians. They are commissioned to preach, to teach, to counsel and to give spiritual guidance. They baptize, witness marriages, and preside at Liturgy of the Word services and funerals. Deacons offer direct service to those in need, especially to those who are marginalized and most vulnerable. In all that they do, permanent deacons act as servants of the Church.

We are most appreciative of the work they do as servants of the Church! Please feel free to thank them personally for their service.


## Christ at the Center – One-Day Marriage Retreat

"Putting Christ at the center of our married lives is crucial for maintaining a strong marriage"




### Welcome New Parishioners

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.

 **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept **Infant Baptism** registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and **Later Baptism** registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age-appropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on Mar 15, Apr 26 & May 10 from 10-11:30 am. Preparation for **Later Baptism** will be held in-person on Feb 22 from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. We encourage families to register and complete their preparation as early as possible. Baptisms will be celebrated on Feb 23 and May 4 & 25. **SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old as this is considered the age of reason. [Registration for \(Spring Cycle 3\) 2025](#) is now **FULL**. Stay tuned for announcements for new sessions.

 **SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION:** In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. [Registration for 2025 \(Spring Cycle 2\)](#) is now **OPEN**. To register your child please fill the [Online Registration Form](#) or use the QR code 

 **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!

**For later marriages:** For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.

**Marriage Enrichment:** This one day, "Christ at the Center" retreat (Feb. 22nd, 2025) is your opportunity to refocus your marriage on Christ. Even when a marriage is going smoothly, there are always opportunities to make it work better.

**RCIA:** Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.
