## Sunday Gospel Reflection

#### The Glory of God (Luke 9:28b-36)

At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus's true identity had been revealed to the we can see the glory of God in those around us. Apostles and today on the mountain, the glory of God was revealed in the transfigured Jesus, the one who discussed His suffering and death with Moses and Elijah.

The divine voice offered assurances that what Jesus taught about suffering was pleasing to God, giving the Apostles a foretaste of glory which they could recall and look back upon, when they saw Jesus hanging on the cross.

We might want to share in Jesus's glory, but we can only do so by sharing in His suffering. Lent is a time for us to enter into this commitment of their teacher suffering, not merely through reflection, prayer, and penance, but to allow God's divine presence to be revealed to us. If we stay' awake',

He is revealed in those whose integrity strengthens us, in those whose religious sentiments inspire us, and in those who get involved in bettering the lives of others.

God's love is seen in the compassionate, the patient, and His mercy in the forgiving. There are many among us whose example we should follow. The worker who takes pride in a job well done, a person who looks in on a sick friend or neighbour, a grandparent who willingly looks after children or a student who is appreciative of the

The Glory of God is revealed to us in very ordinary ways, if we open our eyes.

A silver rose, currently on a ninemonth pilgrimage, will be the centerpiece of the communal Rosarv prayer service on Sunday morning before the 8am Mass. The Knights of Columbus Father Bonner Council has temporary stewardship of an icon of our Blessed Mother, which was blessed by St. Pope John Paul II. Encased within the silver rose is a thread from Juan Diego's cloak and soil from the place where Mary appeared to him.

The journey of the silver rose began

on February 22nd in Calgary and will conclude on December 12th in Mexico, on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. At each stop along the pilgrimage, the silver rose serves as a rosary-centered occasion to pray for respect for life, the spiritual renewal of each nation, and the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The icons will be displayed during the 7:25am Sunday communal Rosary and will remain on display for personal veneration and rosary before and after all Masses, until 2 pm.






NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept Infant Baptism registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and Later Baptism registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other ageappropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on April 7 & 26, May 5 & 10. Baptisms will be celebrated on May 4 (full), 25, June 22, July 13 & 27. More dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacraments-Baptism. SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.



RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.
