Sunday Gospel Reflection By Deacon Tom




Be reconciled with God (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32)

The gospel story of the brothers is unfinished. Each was guilty of sin: the younger one, of greed (or covetousness) and the older, of envy (or jealousy). Envy is the sin which caused Lucifer and some angels to fall from grace and Cain to kill his brother Abel. In response to the older son's envy, the father showed love.

The father was merciful and forgiving and his love for them went beyond their petty greed and jealousy. Were they ever reunited?

We are called to a profound and total reconciliation, first with God and then with one another. The act of reconciling is God's, but we must freely respond to Him. God does not prevent our sinning, but gives us free will, as the father gave his son free will to leave home. Once we recognize our sin and

to be reconciled with God, and it's God's desire that we be reconciled with one another as well. Reconciliation requires that we be open to giving and receiving forgiveness.

The restoration of broken relationships may be characterized as being found alive ("this son of mine was dead and is alive again: he was lost and is found!"). The killing of the calf (enough to feed over a hundred people) meant that the whole village would participate in the reconciliation.

God does not prevent our sinning, but gives us free will, as the father gave his son free will to leave home. Once we recognize our sin and are sorry, God forgives us and receives us with open arms as the father of the prodigal son.




Welcome New Parishioners

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.















SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept **Infant Baptism** registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and **Later Baptism** registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age-appropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on April 7 & 26, May 5 & 10. Baptisms will be celebrated on May 4, 25 (full), June 22, July 13 & 27. More dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the <u>Baptism Requirements</u> document under <u>Sacraments-Baptism</u>. Please email all baptism enquiries to <u>Baptism.STM@caedm.ca</u> or contact Tracy at the office (780) 434 6313 for further assistance.

SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!

For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.

RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.
