

Sunday Gospel Reflection

Merciful Forgiveness (John 8:1-11)

This act of merciful forgiveness by Jesus has a few lessons for us. Though we are all sinners and have offended God in many ways, He is merciful and knows and understands our weaknesses and frailties.

No matter how many and how serious our sins may have been, no matter how low we may have fallen, the mercy and forgiveness of God is there for the asking.

Jesus was able to forgive this woman and send her away as he took the burden of her sin on his shoulders. In the not so distant future, Jesus will take her sin, the sins of her accusers and all our sins on His shoulders, to free us from the bondage of sin and reopen to us the gates of heaven. He would do this by His suffering and death, by His passion and crucifixion, by a death He voluntarily accepted.

We must also imitate Jesus's mercy by being more merciful and more compassionate towards sinners. While we must hate sin in ourselves and others we must learn from Jesus to love the sinner even while disapproving of the sin. He does not condemn the woman, but neither does He exonerate her.

Let us thank God for sending His divine Son to redeem us and for the merciful sacrament of forgiveness, the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We should use this sacrament as often as necessary to keep our souls in the state of sanctifying grace and our penance a means of gaining eternal salvation.






NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept Infant Baptism registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and Later Baptism registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other ageappropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on April 7 & 26, May 5 & 10. Baptisms will be celebrated on May 4, 25 (full), June 22, July 13 & 27. More dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacraments-Baptism. SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Stay tuned for our Summer Intensive class!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



For later marriages: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.



RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Enquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.
