Summer Schedule Changes: Starting July 2 until August 14, all weekday Masses will be at 8:30 AM. First Saturdays are cancelled for July and August.

Nave Roof Replacement: As we continue to share the vision of the Divine Mercy Project—St. Thomas More's future daughter parish—we also remain committed to the ongoing care of our current parish home. Recent inspections have confirmed the need to replace the 27-year-old cedar shakes on the roof of the church nave. Based on the recommendation of our Parish Building Maintenance Lead, Peter Semchuk, and drawing on the successful approach used at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, we will be replacing the existing cedar shakes with a metal roof expected to last 50 years. The installation of the new roof is scheduled to take place through August and September.

This work is being funded through the parish's Building and Maintenance Reserve—an account carefully built up over time through regular Sunday offerings, specifically to support major upkeep projects like this. Preventative maintenance is also continuing on our flat roofs to help extend their lifespan by another 5 to 10 years.

Sunday Gospel Reflection

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Luke 9:11b-17)

Today we celebrate the real presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus in the elements of the Eucharist (Corpus Christi). This presence happens through the change which the church calls transubstantiation ("change of substance") when at the Consecration of the Mass, the Priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me."

The miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fish, foreshadows the miracle of Jesus changing the bread and wine into His own body and blood. At the last supper Jesus gives Himself over as food and drink before being handed over by others to become a victim of sacrifice (crucifixion).

The body and blood of Christ are offered as a sacrifice for us, and every time we reenact this sacrifice, we renew this sacrifice, for "as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

The bread that is broken is the bread of a thanksgiving sacrifice, and the blood that is consumed is the blood that confirms the covenant between us and God. The broken bread is Jesus' broken physical body, broken through His crucifixion and the wine is His blood poured out in atonement for our sins.

Let us be transformed by the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, giving the Holy Spirit room to work in our hearts and grow our faith.

	<p>NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.</p>
	<p>SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept Infant Baptism registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and Later Baptism registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age-appropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on July 7 & 19, Aug 11 & 16, Sep 13 & 15. Baptisms will be celebrated on June 22, July 13 & 27, Aug 24, Sep 21, more dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacraments-Baptism. Please email all baptism enquiries to Baptism.STM@caedm.ca or contact Tracy at the office (780) 434 6313 for further assistance.</p>
	<p>SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Summer Intensive class, registration is now open!!</p>
	<p>SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Summer Intensive class, registration is now open!!</p>
	<p>SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!</p>
	<p>FOR LATER MARRIAGES: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.</p> <p>RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Inquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.</p>
