Sunday Gospel Reflection

The Spirit of God (John 20:19-23)

Pentecost day is called the "Birth-day" of the Church. It is the anniversary of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, a sign of the infinite love of God for us, his Chosen People of the new Covenant. Today, Jesus breathed on the Apostles, and the Holy Spirit came upon them, allowing them to give life to all who hear and obey them. Like Jesus, the Holy Spirit is sent by the Father, not as a substitute for Jesus but an emissary, continuing the mission of Jesus by reminding the Apostles of the things Jesus taught them.

The spirit of God (the Holy Spirit) is also the breath of God. It is mentioned in the creation of Adam (Genesis 2:7) and the restoration of Israel after the Exile (Ezekiel 37).

Through our Baptism we become members of Christ's body, his Church and in Confirmation, we are made children of God by the Holy Spirit. As God's 'Spirit-guided' children can escape the slavery of sin and with Jesus are able to address God as "Abba! Father!"

The experience of Pentecost is to come upon us like the sound of the rush of a violent wind, giving us tongues, as of fire and filling us with the Holy Spirit!

The Holy Spirit opened to us the way of salvation, putting grace and truth within our reach. Let us follow the lead of this grace, for it will lead us to an eternity of happiness with Jesus forever, in heaven.


NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments New Parishioners may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept Infant Baptism registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and Later Baptism registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age-appropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on June 9 & 14, July 7 & 19, Aug 11 & 16, Sep 13 & 15. Baptisms will be celebrated on June 22, July 13 & 27, Aug 24, Sep 21, more dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacraments-Baptism. SACRAMENT OF First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Summer Intensive class, registration is now open!!



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Summer Intensive class, registration is now open!!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



FOR LATER MARRIAGES: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.



RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Inquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9 pm.
