

Fall 2025 STM Scripture Study

CUSTOM CRAFTING OF OUR NEW CRUCIFIX!



Exciting updates to our parish!!

We are very excited to share some important updates to our parish church that will deepen our worship and devotion. First, a new crucifix is being crafted for our sanctuary. Our current cross, while beautiful, presents a glorified image of Christ already risen. This depiction misses central aspects of Catholic devotion to the cross—the wounds, the nails, the crown of thorns, the title INRI (Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews), and even the wood of the cross—all of which draw us into the reality of our Lord's Passion. The Mass makes present for us the Last Supper, which is inseparably linked to Christ's sacrifice on Calvary and we hope that this new crucifix will help us to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's sacrifice made present at every Mass.

Along with the new crucifix, our tabernacle will be moved into the sanctuary, placed directly beneath the crucifix. This placement beautifully highlights the truth that it is from Christ's love poured out on the cross that we receive the Eucharist. It is also fitting that the Eucharistic Lord, the very heart and center of our faith, be placed centrally and prominently in our Church and in the sanctuary.

The chapel will be transformed into a space dedicated for adoration. This will give us a quiet, prayerful place to spend time with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We are truly blessed to have this new space and we look forward to all the graces it will bring to our parish community.


NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible. Opening the lines of communication between parish and family is very important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year. We welcome new parishioners on October 19th at 2pm.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Infant Group Baptisms are celebrated year-round, except during Advent and Lent. We accept Infant Baptism registrations from unborn baby to children under the age of 7 and Later Baptism registrations for children between the ages of 7 and 15, who would like to be baptized and receive all other age-appropriate sacraments. A Baptism Preparation program is required for both parents and godparents, and we offer both, in-person and online preparation options. Upcoming In-person preparation classes for Infants are on Oct 6 & 18, Nov 3 & 8 and Dec 1 & 13. Baptisms will be celebrated on Oct 19 & 26. More dates for preparation and Baptism for 2025—2026 are available on our website in the Baptism Requirements document under Sacraments-Baptism. SACRAMENT OF FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason.




SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



FOR LATER MARRIAGES: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. A suitable later marriage preparation can be made available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.
