Sunday Gospel Reflection

Today you will be with me in Paradise (Luke 23:35-43)

Jesus entered this world as a King and he died as a King. When he was born in a stable in Bethlehem, the Magi came to visit and adore him, bringing him three gifts: gold, frankingense and myrrh of which gold is given only to royalty. For our sake, his sheep, Jesus willingly endured humiliation and death. Stripped, tied and nailed to a cross, his outreached arms embraced women and men from every corner of the world.

Jesus' kingdom (Paradise). On the cross, the good thief rebukes the other, believes in Jesus, turns to him, repents, confesses his sin and asks for forgiveness. His day of crucifixion became the day of his entry into Paradise. We are saved in the exact same way, all we have to do is ask. It was through

the blood of Jesus that redemption was won and sins forgiven. It is from the cross that Jesus rules with authority, because it was through the cross that he too entered into his kingdom.

As King, Jesus gives us a share in the inheritance of the saints, deliverance from darkness and through faith and baptism, entrance into the kingdom of

Today Jesus assures a dying criminal that he will be granted entrance into In the last words of the gospel, words with which our entire Liturgical Year is brought to completion, Jesus opens heaven's gates to a repentant sinner: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." These are the words we all long to hear.



New Parishioners: Welcome! We value your friendship and your dedication to the life of this parish. Registration clearly announces your arrival in the parish and enables us to communicate with you as soon as possible, this is important. Parish membership is essential before some sacraments may be administered. This is particularly true of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage. Registration is an effective initiation tool into the life of the parish and helps us to best serve your interests and that of your family. A "New Parishioner Welcome" happens usually twice a year.




SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: We are delighted to celebrate the Sacrament of Children's Baptism throughout the year, except during Advent and Lent. For infants and children under 7 years old, baptisms are typically held once or twice monthly. For older children, aged 7 to 15, we offer "Later Baptism" followed by other age-appropriate sacraments 2-3 times per school year. Please note that Nov. 30, 2025, and Feb. 7, 2026 are the only 2 remaining Accommodated Baptisms available for the older children during this school year. Parents and godparents are required to complete a Baptism Preparation program. We encourage you to review the Baptism Requirements document on our website under the page of Sacraments & Baptism. This document provides details on registration (pages 1-2), preparation options (page 3), and available baptism schedule (pages 4-6). Please be aware that registration requirements must be completed 2 weeks prior to the baptism date, and bookings fill up quickly. We strongly encourage all parents, including expectant parents, to begin the registration process as early as possible. If you wish to register for the upcoming baptism celebrations on Nov. 30, or the in-person preparation sessions on Dec. 13, please contact Tracy Lam at (780) 434-6313 ext. 233, or email Baptism.STM@caedm.ca for assistance.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION: Most Catholic children receive their First Holy Communion when they are 7 or 8 years old, as this is considered the age of reason. Registration for cycle 2 is now open!



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, most young people receive the sacrament when they are 11-12 years old. Registration for Cycle 2 is now open!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: "Time to buy the ring!" Please give 6 months notice in booking your wedding date! Step one is to meet with the priest, even before booking a hall. Time is needed to accommodate the preparation of wedding documents and attending a Catholic Marriage Preparation program. St. Thomas More runs its program annually in mid-March. Watch for details. Other programs are available in the Diocese. If you are considering a non-Catholic wedding, please don't! Civil weddings or ones done by a non-Catholic minister of religion are not sacramentally valid. The logic is simple. Weddings outside the church often result in families outside the church. Catholics are obliged to be married in the presence of a priest, in the consecrated space of a church dedicated to the celebration of all sacraments. Being married by a random person in a random place does not represent the kind of intention one would hope to have on one of the most anticipated days of one's life. Consider prayerfully the dignity of this sacrament of love at the service of the gospel, that, as St. Paul says, is a symbol of the love of Christ for His bride, the Church. We welcome the opportunity to support you in your journey towards the joyful celebration of your marriage!



FOR LATER MARRIAGES: For those married civilly or in a common-law arrangement, please consider completing the Sacrament of Marriage by a process of Convalidation. Later marriage preparation is available to you. We are happy to accommodate you.

RCIA: Adults (16+years old) seeking to become Catholic, please speak to Paul Givens. Inquirers are always welcome. Please drop by the Parish office or call (780) 434 6313. This is also an opportunity for renewal of Catholic Adults. Runs early September to Easter/Pentecost. Meets Thursday evenings 7 to 9pm.
