Sunday Gospel Reflection

The Lamb of God (John 1:29-34)

Jesus was not only the lamb of God, he was the servant of the Lord, who came to unite all people and bring new life to those who suffer. His baptism was not only for the forgiveness of sins, but for reopening heaven for us.

In the Old Testament a lamb without blemish was slaughtered by each Jewish family before the Exodus from Egypt and sacrificed at the feast of the Passover.

By calling Jesus the lamb John is declaring his sacrificial death. Like a lamb, Jesus would allow himself to be led away to be slaughtered, willingly enduring the death of crucifixion.

Paul tells us that we have been called to be Apostles, a call we received when we were baptized, as through our Baptism our sins are forgiven (washed away) and

we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

As Apostles, we are to work to unite broken families, bring new life to those in despair and be a light in the midst of darkness. The saving grace of God shines through when we love those in our lives with the love of God, treat others with the compassion of God and preach the gospel through the way we live our lives.

Let us go forward in this new year as apostles of Jesus, faithful members of His flock, continuing to honour him by receiving the sacraments of His church, and enabling the blood of the lamb to wash away our sins and lead us to eternal salvation.





Liturgy of the Hours

often called the Divine Office, is the daily prayer of the Church. It is an extension of the Eucharistic liturgy, allowing the praise and worship of God to continue throughout the entire day. Across the world and throughout history, priests, deacons, religious communities, and countless lay faithful unite in structuring their day around these same prayers.

Evening Prayer: Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4 pm

At its heart, the Liturgy of the Hours is rooted in the prayer of Jesus Himself. Christ prayed constantly with the Psalms, and when we pray the Hours, we join our voices to His eternal prayer to the Father. The Psalms and readings shape our hearts, teaching us to see every part of life in the light of God's presence.

The Liturgy of the Hours invites us into deeper communion with the universal Church and with Christ, who we long to imitate with our prayer.
